BOARD DISCUSSION MEETING

7:00 The board discussion meeting was called to order.

Call Meeting to Order (Dave Weaver, chair)

- SE Uplift's mission statement and community agreements pertaining to behavior during board meetings were shared.
- Introductions and announcements were posted by board members in the chat.
- Recording policy was announced

7:10 Executive Director Updates (Nanci Champlin, Executive Director)

Light Our Parks Community Roundtable was held on March 14th: In response, PP&R is planning and removing light posts in 8 SE Portland Parks (12 citywide) **The event drew about 50** participants. **23** Groups Signed on to SEUL Letter to Mayor, Comm Ryan, PPR Director Long

- 1. Allocate expedited funding to restore lighting to all parks where light posts have already been removed.
- 2. **Postpone further light removal** in all remaining targeted parks and open spaces until funding for interim solutions and swift light replacement can be secured.
- 3. Pursue a meaningful community engagement process.

On March 29th news Broke that:

- Commissioner Ryan will present an emergency ordinance on Wednesday to City Council to allow the Parks Bureau to purchase all replacement light poles simultaneously.
- The new plan will have a phased light pole removal approach and a coordinated replacement timeline to reduce the time that parks will have fewer light poles.
- After procurement, the fabrication and delivery of new light poles will take six months.
- Light poles removed at Irving Park, **Colonel Summers Park**, Sellwood Park, and Sellwood Riverfront Park will be replaced by PP&R once the new light poles are available.

Action: Sign up to testify or send written comment to Request that the replacement poles:

• Gather input from the public on the light pole design, including: Replicate the historic design of existing poles, Warm lighting, Considers ways to mitigate light pollution.

In other updates:

Workshop, March 29th: Building Engaged Neighborhoods: The Power of Events and Committees had about 10 Participants, was a great roundtable of ideas that spotlighted strategies of BAC, SMILE and ENA. Tips + Best Practices will get circulated.

Board Alignment Workshop (part I) w/Creston-Kenilworth NA co-created a set of Values and Beliefs for comms, volunteer recruitment. Part II will develop an action plan around them. 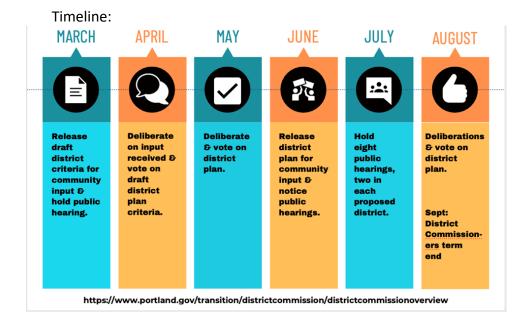
THINGS TO WATCH

Independent Districting Commission

- 13 community members make up Portland's Independent District Commission
- They are tasked with establishing 4 geographic districts for future city council elections.
- Portlanders will elect 3 city counselors to each district = city council of 12

The districts:

- will be contiguous and compact,
- utilize existing geographic or political boundaries,
- not divide communities of common interest,
- be connected by transportation links, and
- be of equal population.

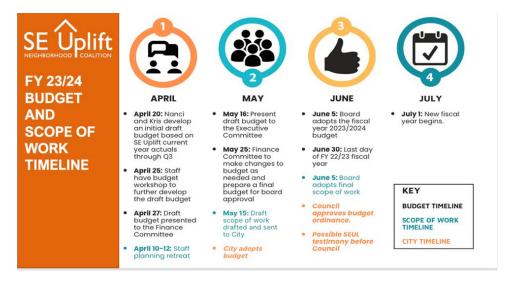

- Updates:
- The Just Crossing Alliance, which includes SE Uplift, have launched the Right Size, Right Now S.A.F.E.R. Bridge Campaign. The campaign advocates for a new earthquake-ready I-5 bridge that builds support for environmental justice and is affordable for everyone while spending within our means. The campaign is holding a day-of-action at the Oregon State Capital in Salem on April 13th. - The committee received an update from the Bureau of Planning & Sustainability on the Parking Compliance Amendment Project. The project aims to align parking minimums citywide with state mandates while streamlining the design process and requiring green options on larger lots.
